



Did you know that a bat's big ears help it to hear, find, and catch an insect very quickly?






I wish I had ears like a bat. Then I could find the noisy cricket that keeps me awake at night.





Did you know that a porcupine has sharp quills to keep other animals away? Their quills make them quite untouchable. Ouch!






I wish I had quills like a porcupine. Then I'd have lots of room in the car. No one would want to sit by me.






Did you know that a frog can see what is behind it without turning its head? This helps it look out for danger and for food.
