

Halves and Fourths and Thirds






Come on in. Listen close. Pay attention to our words.

I've lost a half just like me somewhere in this bowl. Find my half and you will see that we can make one whole.

















Fourths come from a whole divided equally in four.

one tomato on a platter.




















Thirds come from a whole divided equally in three.


I am just one third, and I'm as lonely as can be.
