


Hooray, Hooray for the One Hundredth Day!

“On Thursday,” said Ms. Wood, “we will be celebrating the one hundredth day of school. You may bring or wear 100 of something.”



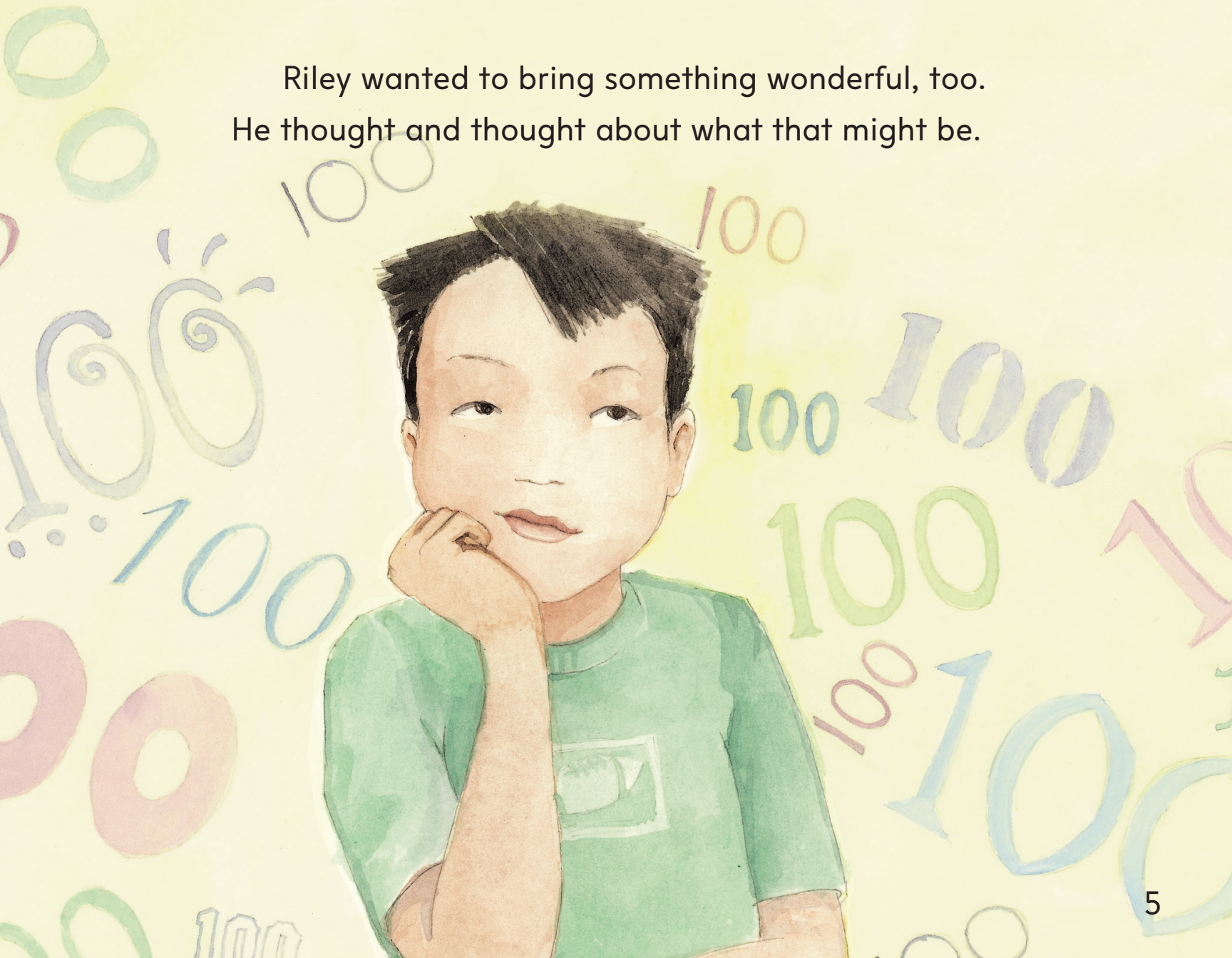
“Hooray, hooray for the one hundredth day!” shouted the children.
