

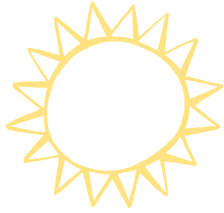
# Whatever the Weather



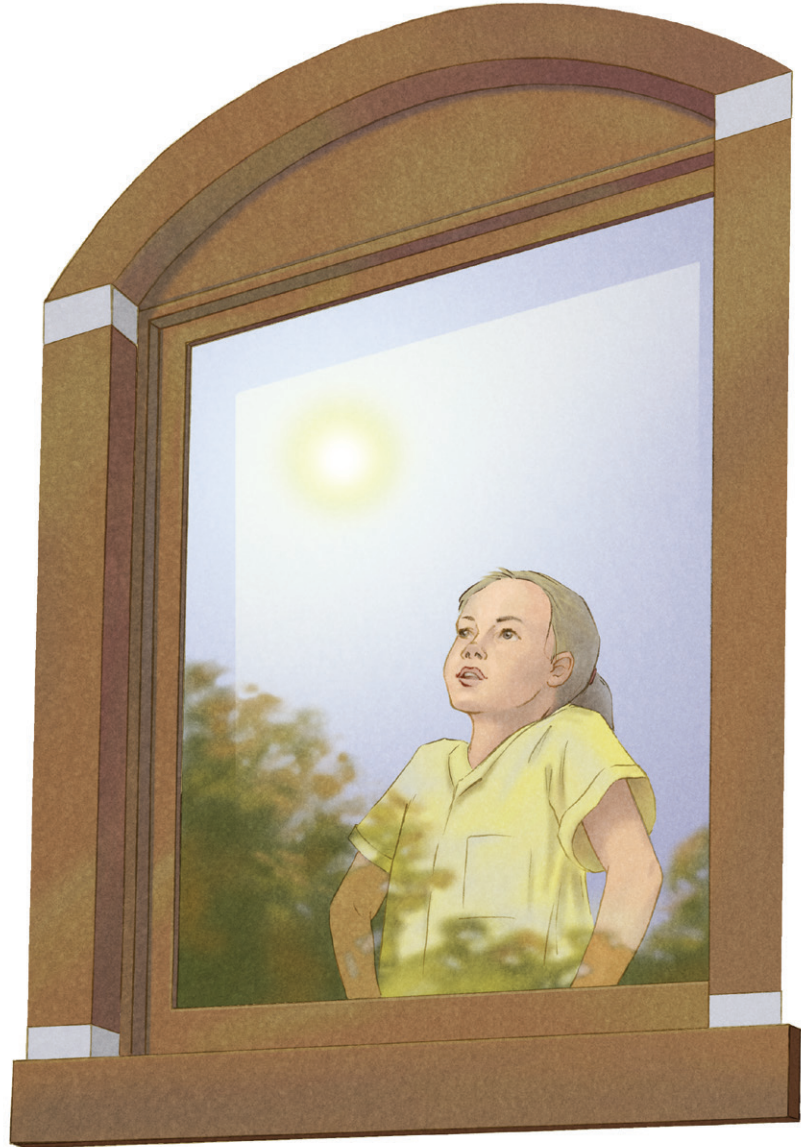
