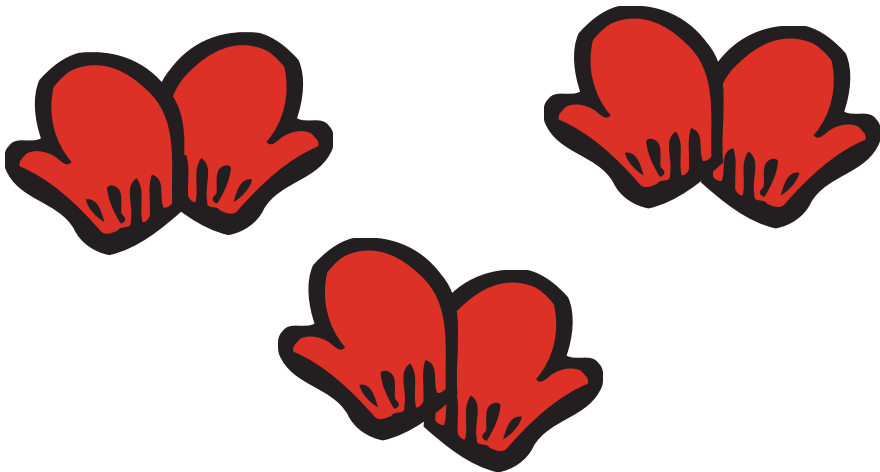
This book features the letter *Kk*. The rhyme helps children expand their vocabulary and learn about the sounds of language.

Tips for Reading Together

- Point to each word as you read.
- Hunt together for the letter *Kk*.
- Listen for words that rhyme. For example—*kittens*, *mittens*. What other words rhyme with these words?
- Enjoy the rhythm of the book. Sing, clap, or dance!
- Look for interesting words. Talk about their meanings. Can you think of words with similar meanings?
- Read again! It's helpful to read rhymes again and again.
