Sing along with Rusty and Rosy to practice the sounds of a, e, i, o, and u.

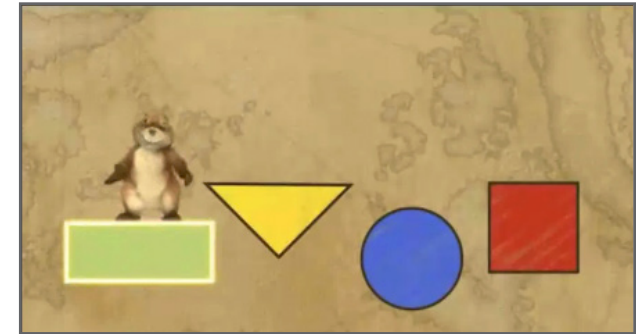

Sing along with this fun version of a classic nursery rhyme.

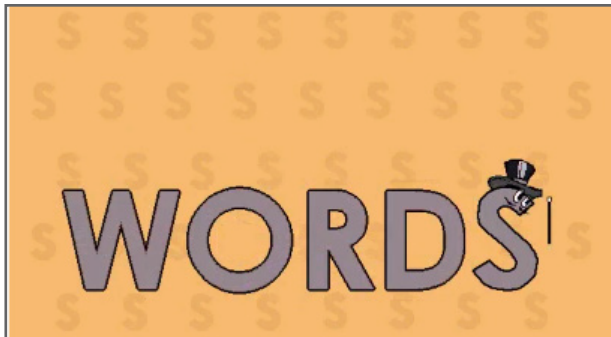

Sing along and count to 20.

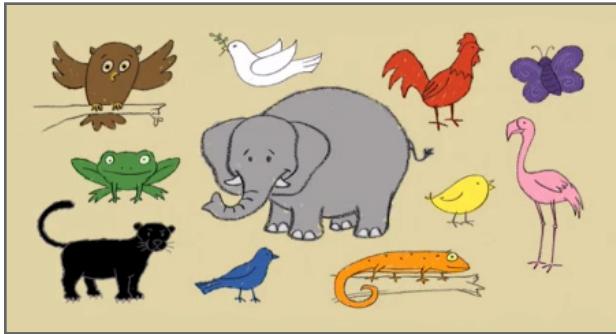
