**Measurement & Data** skills help children use numbers to understand the world around them.

Your child will use numbers when looking at data in a graph, telling time, counting money, and more.

## Try these fun activities at home or on the go!

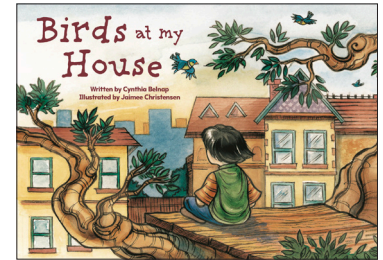
**Step Exploration** Count both your steps and your child's steps from point A to point B. For example, how many steps are there from the kitchen to the front door? Did you take the same number of steps? Did one of you take more steps?

**Tick, Tock, Routine** With your child, write a list of the important activities they do each day. Include the start times. Go through the list together and review the activities and times. This will help your child establish a routine and learn to tell time.

**Adult** We have lunch at 12:30 pm. What do you do after lunch every day?

**Child** Story time!

**Adult** You're right! That means at 1:00 pm everyday you have story time.



Your child will read a story about a child who uses measurement to create a bird feeder.



This activity helps your child learn to read and create bar graphs.



Your child listens to a song about comparing sizes.
